# A word from your president... Roy Vasey

I would like to comment on one matter though. On Thursday, December 16, 2010, Hayden Bullen, an RKCC member, had a bad fall on the ice and was taken away by ambulance. Not to worry, he is recovering well, and in fact, visited the Club last week to see how things were going. The fall was a result of a heart issue. While many persons contributed to Hayden's care, there are two RKCC members who deserve special acknowledgement for their quick thinking and life saving aid that day, Frank Cervenko and Mike Parks. Frank is a retired physician. He was the first to reach Hayden on the ice. He detected no pulse, ordered Mike to assist him with CPR, and Frank proceeded to revive Hayden. The paramedics arrived very quickly from the Fire Station across the street, but if Frank and Mike hadn't acted as they did, any delay in treatment may have resulted in a very different outcome. I convey the heart-felt thanks of the Board to these two persons for their actions. I would also like to thank the other members who visited Hayden in the hospital, and sent get-well cards and well-wishes to Hayden and his family during this very trying time.

In closing, I wish everyone the best for the rest of the season and 'good curling'.

## Operations Committee

ICE SCRAPER

The new ice scraper has been received and is in use. My discussions with Rod have resulted in very positive feedback. The old machine will now be traded in. We believe the machine will improve our ice conditions. There is one minor modification required for this machine and that is to install plywood to level the storage area with carpeted area. This will prevent the blade from touching the concrete when being moved in and out. It was necessary to make a new ramp for the machine and this has been done.

#### SAFETY PROCEDURES

At present we have only one safety procedure written and it covers our portable stairway.

A meeting was held with on Friday the 7<sup>th</sup> of January with CESafety a safety company who have offered to write many safety procedures at no charge for RKCC. The idea was passed through the Governance Committee and approved at the Board meeting on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> of January. Before proceeding it will first be established that the site specific procedures are the property of RKCC otherwise we will not proceed.

#### BUILDING

An unusual incident involving an HVAC unit which tripped off meant loss of heat in part of the building. Modern Niagara, our service provider was called and they reset it; no reason for the trip was determined.

Rod and Terry are still giving us the best ice in eastern Ontario.


