## Committee Reports



The members of your 2011-12 Marketing Committee; Bruce Jeffery - Chair, Garry Dupuis - Vice-Chair, Roger Taylor and Deanne Clark, are pleased to report that our Advertising Program continues to be a great success and that the efforts of our committee provides a substantial revenue stream for RKCC.

Over the summer, and into the fall, our committee has invested a significant amount of energy into making personal contact with all of our advertisers as a means of expressing our appreciation for their support, in addition to encouraging their continued association as a Sponsor of RKCC. In addition, time and effort has gone into soliciting new sponsors for those lost to attrition as well as undertaking the necessary administrative tasks in that regard.

Unfortunately we have lost the usual few advertisers as we start a new season, which totalled four this year. However, we have been successful in attracting three new Wall Sponsors (Expedia CruiseShipCenter, Insurance Specialty Group Kingston and The Landings Golf Course), which brings our net total to 49 (94% occupancy) and leaves us only a single spot short of last years total.

In addition, as you know, we did unfortunately lose SLH as an In Ice Sponsor leaving us with one vacancy at the start of this year. We are pleased to report however, that Glen Lawrence Golf Club has recently accepted our proposal to become our sixth In Ice Sponsor bringing us again to full capacity in that regard. Signs are currently being fabricated and will be installed as soon as they arrive and the in ice logos are being installed at ice maintenance time at the end of October.

As a reminder to the membership, these Wall & In-Ice Advertisers generate over \$23,000 in income for RKCC, year after year, and we continue to encourage all of you to patronize our RKCC advertisers whenever you are in the market for a product or service that any of them can provide.

#### Finance Committee

We have heard from the Club's Auditor regarding our year end Financial Statements as at April 30, 2011. The Royal Kingston Curling Club enjoyed another successful financial season.

I will cover the Financial Statements ending September 30, 2011 which cover the first five months of this year.

Total revenues are down 6% over the same five months last year. Four categories contributed to this decrease in membership: dues (5%), hall/facility rentals (2%), bar operations (8%) and a decrease of \$4,000 in donations.

Expenses have been kept in check pretty well showing a decrease of 1.5% for the first five months.

The Finance Committee has introduced a Capital Budget as a new reporting tool for the Board.




