The opportunity lies in creating more revenue. We would prefer to do this by increasing our membership as well as increasing the profit that we make when we have bonspiels or other events at the club. We need all the members to keep this in mind when they are running a bonspiel or using the facility for some other function. The days of having an event at a break even budget are over and we need to run at a profit to protect the financial interests of our club for many decades and future generations of curlers.



Other Business

HELP KEEP THE KITCHEN

A reminder to those who use the kitchen at RKCC:

Please ensure that you clean all of your dishes, pots and pans etc. And return them to their storage places.

Please clean all of the food prep areas that you use

Please take the soiled laundry (dishcloths, aprons etc.) home to be laundered and return them to the club as soon as possible.

If you have leftover foods and you wish to leave them for others to use you might first check with Jerry or Julie to see if they have any use for them for the lunches they prepare. If they do not and you still wish to leave these items behind, then it is incumbent on you to check to see if they have been used and to discard perishables. Check the best before dates on such items as salad dressings, milk and coffee cream left behind.

Members and Member groups who are going to use the kitchen for luncheons, bonspiels etc. Would be wise to check the condition of the kitchen a day or two before the event to see that everything is in order.

If we all work together and support one another, we will improve the cleanliness and there will be fewer unpleasant surprises when we arrive to prepare for our events.
