

The Stick Leagues of RKCC

"Once Upon A Time"------No---Wait !!! . I do believe by starting this way it would indicate we were going to hear a "Fairy Tale". Well, this year stick curling does seem like a wonderful fairy tale. It appears everyone in both the two stick league and the four stick league is having a really fun time and enjoying the social side of stick curling. The schedule has worked out well for the two stick league on Wednesdays and also for the four stick league on Thursdays. Once again, we wish to thank the day ladies and day men for making this possible.

The other part of this fairy tale is that no one has had any serious accident on the ice this year and we're sure part of it has to do with all the new grippers on shoes. In keeping with the thought about new grippers we offer a suggestion to help reduce the "slip" that sometimes occurs even with grippers on both feet. When delivering a rock, we usually walk out a predetermined number of paces and when we let go of the rock, we then put on the

brakes with one foot, usually the last one in the stepping sequence. On occasion this last step is slightly longer than all the rest and will create more of an angle on the heel of the braking foot. All of a sudden the sharp end of the heel is touching the ice first and at that point of the gripper, the rubber is very firm and when pushed onto the ice, will create a slip action that could put a player down very quickly. Our suggestion is to make sure all your steps are of equal length, including the last one and if at all possible, just keep walking a few more paces and slow down to a stop with a controlled pace. Once you have let go of the rock, it doesn't matter if you cross the hog line, so don't worry about that. As well, please check your grippers to make sure they are doing the job and if not, make sure to stop in at the pro shop and get yourself some new ones.

Our Christmas Fun Day is coming up really quickly and signup sheets are posted for you to enter your name. The date this year is Friday December 7th. Further information about the day will be posted on the signup sheet which will be in the main hall by the door again this year.

Another coming event which all or most of you will be fully aware of it the 2013 Scotties being held at the K-Rock Centre in downtown Kingston from February 16th until February 24th. A lot of you will be volunteers but don't forget that you can guarantee a seat by buying tickets to the event and there are many specials out now with the new ticket packages.

Getting back to the fun and games of stick curling, we now bring you the standings in the leagues up to and including Thursday November 29, 2012. The shocking news this year is that Russ Brown is not at the top of both the four and two stick leagues. He is however at the top of the 4 stick standings. Now, here is the Fairy Tale Part of this report. There is a princess at the top of the standings in two stick league. Claire Petkow is in first place in the 2 stick league with the princely Bill Worthy tied with her and in the 4 stick league, Russ Brown heads up the standings. It's a tight race in the 4 stick league with the top 4 teams within three points of first place. The 2 stick league is so close that a paper thin draw past a top 12 quard could not describe how close the teams are. The top ten teams are within 6 points of the lead. A novel approach this year in the 4 stick league is the changing up of positions every week by one of our teams so that each player gets to experience what it's like to play at each spot for a whole game. This gives all team players a sense of what it's like to skip a team and see just how it feels to be making the tough last shots of an end. For those of you wondering if this is within the rules of curling, yes it is. You must finish the game with the players in the positions they started the game. Over the years we are very pleased with the growth of our stick league in numbers of players. We know some who played stick last year had to make a choice because of some conflicts with other leagues but our numbers are strong and we expect to see more growth over the next few years. Currently we have 26 two stick teams and 8 four stick teams.

We are hopeful of having ice time available next year to allow us to get up to 36 two stick teams and 12 four stick teams. We are hopeful of moving forward with even numbers of teams next year so as to avoid having any teams deal with a bye week.

Now, here is another suggestion for all you slider curlers who are still at it and having difficulty getting down, getting up, maintaining your balance in the slide, hitting the broom and just plain and simple, dealing with sore knees and hips every time you come out to play.

"News Flash" Relief for sore knees or hip and bad backs, Pick up or borrow a stick and come on out and let us give you some lessons with it and see how much fun it really is to curl using a delivery stick from a standing, walking position. You might be amazed and pleased.
