The main role of the curling committee is to make sure that all sections have sufficient ice time to complete their league schedule and to leave enough time for bonspiel and clinics like "learn to curl". This year, most sections will begin play on the week of Sept 23rd and the season will conclude before Easter Friday on Championship Night, Thursday April 17th.

We have now finished the 2013/14 curling schedule, revised and up-dated the Cards of Intent and the Application Form. The schedule for all sections has remained essentially unchanged. There will be two OCA events this year. Learn to curl will continue on Sundays at 7 pm after the Juniors in the afternoon.

The curling committee recommended a reduced fee for new members curling only once a week. This is similar to the special offer last year and applies to all sections. Also, a new Social Membership (enhanced) will allow stick curlers playing only a one-hour game every week to benefit from a reduced rate.



The buzzer system will stay in place as it has in the past. Many games are not getting to eight ends. Please follow the recommendation below:

- The skip should never have to be waiting for the thrower to get ready to shoot.
- The thrower should be ready in the hack when the skip calls the shot.

This action alone will take minutes off the time of the game.

We are always open to comments and suggestions from members. Your section rep will be happy to raise these at our regular meetings. Curling at the Royal Kingston has always been fun – we intend to work at keeping it that way.



How fast the summers seem to fly by. It is almost time to put away the golf clubs and dust off the curling equipment.

Greetings, to all returning curlers and new curlers joining us on Monday Senior Day Men's Flight and Tuesday and Thursday mornings open curling.

If you are looking to play on Monday and need a team please get your card of intent in early. If skips are looking for players get in contact with me and as players sign up will let you know so you can contact the new curlers.

Lunches will start on the first day of Monday curling. Once you have seen your schedule please volunteer for a Monday lunch. Remember you should be curling at the 130 time when doing a lunch.

There will be an election in early October as I have now completed my two year term. We will need to elect a chair and a vice chair for Day Men. Anybody

interested in either of these two positions should contact me and let me know.

Date and time for the election meeting will be posted in late September.

Hope you are looking forward to curling and will be supporting our lunch program.



Although it may not seem that long ago (a sure sign that I'm definitely getting older), the Royal Kingston Curling Club will be entering it's 193rd year of operation (7 yrs to date at the new location!!). We may not be the oldest club in North America (Royal Montreal Curling Club established in 1807 holds that venerable title) however, we can take pride in having an outstanding facility and more importantly a friendly, supportive curling community.

Last year's mixed section was comprised of 197 members, representing 14 teams each in both Friday Competitive A & B divisions, as well as 13 and 10 teams respectively in the Friday & Sunday Recreational Divisions. The mixed curling website as always, was swiftly and faithfully updated by the ever helpful Teresa Wilson.

Many thanks to Lorne Carmichael and Michael Braun for helping convene our section last year. Michael will be leaving us this year and we wish him well as he redirects his time and energy on the Operations Committee. Cathy Faubert has graciously agreed to continue as our "Snacks Convenor" and we very much appreciated your collective support last year as evidenced by the number of 50/50 tickets purchased and hopefully will continue to do so in the coming year to enable this "value-added" feature to continue.

Pursuant to a survey conducted earlier this summer, the Friday Evening Mixed Section will be adopting a new model which will incorporate some features that have worked well since it's inception by the Evening Men's Flight league.

This year's Mixed Flight scheduling format will hold 3 consecutive round robins, each one consisting of 7

games allowing each team to play every other team in their respective subdivision (eg. A2). This will be followed by playoffs with initial draw positions based on year-end standings.

The Friday Evening Mixed League will be comprised of 3 Divisions (A, B & C) with 2 subdivisions in each i.e. A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, & C2. Each subdivision will accommodate 7 teams with each team incurring 1 bye per round robin.

At the end of <u>each</u> round robin, the top 2 teams in the standings will move up and the bottom 2 teams will move down to the next subdivision e.g. B1 \rightarrow A2; B2 \rightarrow C1, etc. This newer format will allow up to 42 team entries for the Friday Mixed League.

I personally believe this will provide a more level playing field for most mixed curling teams and as a result a greater enjoyment of the game.

<u>MOST IMPORTANTLY</u>: Lorne and I have worked hard to ensure there will be no Saturday Mixed games this year.

NB: The Sunday Recreational League will continue using the same format as last year.

The Stick Leagues of RKCC

Even though it is only August and yes there is more time for golfing, swimming, fishing etc, it is time for you to think about the winter months ahead which definitely means curling for all of us!

If you have knee or back issues the Stick leagues are for you. Although you are now curling the traditional game, consider joining one or both of these leagues to help you transition to a game that is easier on the old body. When you have made the change, you can look forward to curling in a competitive and or, at a social level for years to come!!!!

The Landings Stick League is composed of teams made up of two curlers (any combination male - female - mixed). These games are one hour long, 6 ends each, with each team throwing 6 rocks per end. Sweeping is allowed only from the hog line in. The games are played on Wednesdays at 11:15am and 12:15pm. If there are more than 24 teams wishing to play in this league, games would also be scheduled on Wednesday at 1:15pm and 2:15pm, as required. If this is the "only" league you are able to participate

in, there is now a Social Member (enhanced) Membership which is available. This non-voting membership has the same privileges as a Social Member, but with optional on-ice privileges, which are **limited** to once a week participation in the **2-person Stick League**.

The Bob's Butcher Shop Stick League is made up of teams composed of four curlers (any combination male - female - mixed) and all normal curling rules apply. We now have two additional sheets of ice available on Thursdays at 11:15am - 1:15pm. The additional ice time, will allow this league to continue to grow, as more of us feel the need or desire to deliver with the stick.

The Cards of Intent for the 2013-2014 curling season are now available to fill out on line. For those of you without computer access your applications will be mailed to you. Please complete them ASAP to ensure that you are included in the league(s) of your choice.


