You have heard me complain repeatedly about how we aren't meeting our budget every year and how our expenses our outpacing our revenue but I am happy to say that I finally have some good news to report. Six months into this budget year our total revenue is down about 2% but our expenses are down 3% to put our net surplus up 1% over the same period last year. The biggest contributing factor is with all of our energy saving initiatives we have managed to show a year to date decrease in our hydro bill of 29%. This is a really good start but we can all do better to cut costs and bring more revenue (new members) into the club.

The committee has been hard at work monitoring the Club's finances and helping to ensure that all areas meet or exceed their budget goals. We are just about to start planning the 2015/16 budget so any ideas or suggestions should be presented to the appropriate person very soon if you would like them considered for next years' budget.

#### **Operations Committee**

Operations Committee Report for November 2014:

- 1. Based upon the efforts made last summer I am pleased to report the progress made to date on Energy Savings for the club. The KWH consumption has dropped and we are seeing a cost savings as a result. In October the compressors ran a total of 972 hours the lowest figure since 2010. November figures should even be better.
- On October 27, Head Ice Technician started the program that automatically turns the ice plant off at 11 PM and restarts it at 05:00 AM. The results were very good and no ill effect was seen on ice conditions.
- 3. On November 12 he increased the downtime by one hour and no ill effects were seen. So now the Ice Plant is down from 11:00 PM until 06:00 AM
- 4. With this our ice plant is down 8 hours in every 24 hour period which exceeds expectations and we should see further reduction in energy consumption as a result.
- 5. On Tuesday Nov. 18 during a heavy wind storm the roof rattled to the point where it was difficult to hear on the ice. Upon inspection on Nov. 23 the Operations Committee found the roof in excellent condition with all fasteners secure. The Operations Committee has contacted the building architect and we are currently working with the General Contractor to determine what can be done to further secure the roof. Curlers will be kept informed.

# Section Reports



We are now several weeks into the 2nd Draw and heading toward the Christmas break. The winning team from the 1st Draw has been determined and this is the foursome skipped by Lin Jenkins with Darlene Boucher as vice, Zak Sieben as second and Joanne Cosgrove as lead.
