Finance Committee

The committee has been working on the 2015/16 budget with a "draft budget" presented to the Board at the February Board meeting. We hope to have the final budget approved at the March meeting. We are struggling with the fact that our costs continue to go up and our membership numbers are fairly constant. If we don't bring in new members to the club we will have to find the extra revenue from other sources or we will be forced to raise our membership fees by more than we would like. Please do your part by introducing new members to our club or by using the facilities for an event. Any extra revenue for the club will help us to achieve a balanced budget and keep our dues down.

Governance Committee

Jim Barton, Chair

The following recommendations were made to the Board in February, and were accepted by the Board, as follows:

1. The Committee recommends the following Objectives for 2015/16 to the Board of Directors
 - a) **Ensure the financial sustainability of RKCC**
 - Increase the top line revenue of the club

at a significantly greater rate than inflation or our expenses

- Develop a Policy, including principles, to guide the allocation of club facilities between club use and external (rental/gratis) usage
- Investigate reducing operating costs by maximizing ice utilization within a shorter curling season
- Develop a plan to fully meet our capital cost recovery objective each year
- Continue the evaluation of current energy reduction initiatives and assess additional opportunities for reducing energy costs

b) **Establish improved systems and processes to manage the Human Resources of RKCC**

- Investigate reducing/rebalancing the General Manager's workload by incorporating volunteer help where appropriate
- Request each Board Committee Chair to provide a January Board meeting assessment of their succession plans for committee members for the next year
- Develop an HR Policy which will document all of our HR processes (performance appraisals, salary adjustments, hiring, termination, Personnel Committee processes, etc.) along with a timeline for managing these processes
- Implement more effective processes for managing our volunteers and elevate the role of the Volunteer Co-Ordinator, possibly to Board member status

2. Governance Committee recommends to the Board the creation of a new membership category to be called an Affiliate Member. An Affiliate Member, who is not otherwise a Full Member of RKCC but is eligible to enter OCA Events, would have the right to join an RKCC team for the purpose of engaging in OCA competitions at all levels from Zone to National. The fee for this membership would be \$50. Up to three Affiliate Members may join a team representing RKCC, but at least one member of the team must be a Full Member of RKCC. The Affiliate Membership designation will be added to Membership Policy, Appendix 6, of the Policy and Resource Manual.

3. Governance Committee recommends that funding for Teams representing RKCC and competing in OCA Events, regardless of which Zone they are representing, will be as follows:
 - *Zone*: refund of entry fee for the Team if they advance to Regionals
 - *Provincial*: \$250 for the Team
 - *National*: \$500 suggested, but otherwise at the discretion of the Board

Affiliate Members would not be eligible for the above funding and thus Team funding would be reduced in proportion to the number of Affiliate Members. To be added to the Curlers Handbook.

4. Recommend that RKCC should be available to host up to two OCA events per year, depending on ice availability, with a preference for Regional competitions. Amendment to be made to the Curlers Handbook.
5. Recommended that appropriate signs be posted at the entry to locker rooms advising members that due to allergies and enhanced sensitivities of some members it is requested that members refrain from wearing excessive fragrances.

Notice of Motion for the April Annual General Meeting:

The following, which has been approved by the Board, will replace the corresponding sections of the current By-Laws and will be presented to the AGM for approval. The number of Board committees has been corrected and the new tenure limits for Directors have been clarified.

7 DIRECTORS

Final authority for the government and management of the Club shall be vested in a Board of Directors of the Club consisting of twelve (12) Voting members of the Royal Kingston Curling Club. Directors shall be eligible for election to three (3) consecutive one (1) year terms for any particular role on the Board and for a cumulative total of (9) nine one year terms as a Director in any role. This Policy does not apply to the role of Past President. Exceptions may be granted with the approval of more than 2/3 of the Directors.

7.1 Directors

7.1.1 This group shall consist of twelve (12) members of the Royal Kingston Curling Club

including: the immediate Past President and eleven (11) qualified Voting members. These eleven (11) Directors will fill the following positions of responsibility: President, Vice-President, Finance Chair, Human Resources and Communications Chair, Secretary, Curling Committee Chair, Operations/Resources Committee Chair, Marketing Committee Chair, Membership Committee Chair, Social Committee Chair, Member at Large.



Operations Committee

Reg Gore, Chair

Roof Repair:

1. Working with Steelway and have confirmed that the repair work & labor on the existing cracks, will be performed under warranty.
2. It has been decided by your Operations Committee that the most efficient way to approach a remedial solution is to deal directly with the firm that manufactures the Windbar and perform the work ourselves. RKCC would only have to cover the material cost which we are working on. This approach has received approval from Steelway.
3. Budget was presented to Finance Committee for presentation and review by the Board
4. Brian Dowling has approached the Operations Committee with a proposal to address the recovering of the club brooms. Currently these are being washed on a regular basis by the Ice Technicians. This will be presented to the Board as a separate topic.
5. Operations Committee is actively pursuing the piping requirements required to take advantage of the heat recovery system now in place on the compressors but never utilized. This would provide hot water for the Ice Technicians to be used for ice maintenance and flooding. Cost

- currently unknown but it is expected to be affordable and is another energy saving exercise.
6. Total run time of compressors for January was 825 hours down 278 hours from 2013 and equivalent to 9 hours per day.
 7. Members of the Operations Committee met with Cimco on Friday Feb. 13, 2015 to review a new contract proposal. The current contract format is no longer offered in that it covered the labour for all call ins. The new contract has a lower annual fee but the call ins will be charged to the club as an extra. The contract should be finalized before the end of February for Board approval.
 8. Incident occurred last week with the downspout from the lounge roof area freezing and creating free water on roof surface. Our thanks to Mike Braun & Gord Greer for freeing the downspout. Remedial action will have to be taken in the summer to heat trace the downspout in a more extensive fashion to prevent a recurrence.

The Greater Kingston Continental Cup is based on the Continental Cup of Curling format. All games will be played at RKCC.

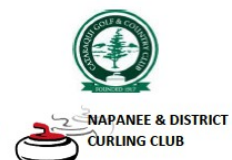

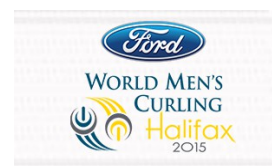
