A word from your President... Mike Schneider

I hope everyone has been enjoying their summer. Once again this summer, there have been a lot of volunteer initiatives going on at RKCC since curling ended in April.

As you will hear more about these initiatives as you read the other articles in this month's Sweep, rather than reiterate these initiatives I'd like to focus your attention on the future.

So how does the future look for RKCC? In business, when you look forward to the future you often start by performing a SWOT analysis; SWOT standing for Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats.

Let's look at a few of our strengths. As you are likely aware, RKCC is one of the oldest curling clubs in Canada, with our bicentennial coming up in 2020. We are steeped with history and annually run two major bonspiels that have both been in existence for more than 60 years. We are mortgage free and in much better financial shape than the vast majority of Canadian curling clubs. In the short term, we will have no problem flourishing through to our bicentennial.

So why is the board so focussed on balancing our budget? As we've mentioned throughout the past year, our demographics are, at least in one respect, a weakness for the longer term. With over half our members over the age of 60, chances are we will be losing more than 300 of our existing members in the next 10 to 20 years even if we retain 100% of the existing members who are under the age of 60. Without a continued infusion of new members to replace those who leave the club, it will be a struggle to continually increase our revenue at the same rate as inflation. Thanks to the efforts of the Membership Committee we have come very close to adding enough new members to replace those who have left in the past two years.

Fortunately our aging demographics are a two edged sword. Not only a weakness but a towering strength. Perhaps the club's greatest strength is the culture of volunteerism that permeates RKCC. And



RKCC lost a good and loyal friend when Brian passed away in May. To say that Brian, a Life Member, was an asset to RKCC would be an understatement. Everyone who knew Brian realized that his dedication and commitment to our club was both unselfish and without expectation of acknowledgement.

Brian did whatever was needed of him behind the scenes with passion and diligence, whether he was setting up a draw for a section or event, or keeping the kitchen equipped and tidy, as a long-time member of the kitchen committee. Many new curlers might not have gotten to know Brian personally but his efforts touched each and every member at some time. Perhaps it was through his graphic arts talents in preparing countless posters and programs, serving as unofficial photographer for many events, helping to prepare tasty meals in the kitchen or just doing whatever needed doing. He also created and managed the Sr. men's Flight schedule and website for many years.

Brian had an avid interest in the history of RKCC and often served as an unofficial archivist. He maintained innumerable photo albums and manuals of past bonspiels. In addition, Brian photographed all of the Club's trophies in preparation for the move to 130 Day's Road in 2006.

Brian was a good competitive player and was on numerous winning teams: Famous Fisherman's 2002; Opening Spiel of 2006; RKCC and City Mixed Champions, 2005 & 2012; Garrison Rocking Chair Spiels of '98 and '99. Brian also enjoyed venturing out to many out-oftown bonspiels and forged enduring friendships with curlers all across the region.

Although much of Brian's time revolved around the curling club he had many other interests, making for a well-rounded life. His interests in music, antiques, car racing, food and cooking, politics, history, reading, travel, and gardening, not to mention his appreciation for a good cappuccino or a relaxing meal on a downtown patio were integral parts of what made Brian "tick".

These few words cannot do justice to all that Brian was to us but it is hoped that they remind us all how much our club depends on the efforts and kindness of each of us and Brian was a perfect example of that. The great attendance at Brian's Celebration of Life in July was a testament to that and was a credit to Brian.

You may have noticed Brian and April's sponsorship rock, red 3 on sheet 3, which simply says "Brian and April" – nothing more, nothing less, just like Brian's philosophy on life. It seems hard to believe that we are talking about the upcoming curling season when we are experiencing the nicest weather of the summer. However, curling is just around the corner and all RKCC committees are planning for a great season.

As the new chair of the Finance Committee and new to the Board as a whole, I am encouraged to see the commitment of a significant number of member volunteers that have taken up the cause of providing their time, expertise and dedication to making sure this club operates at the highest possible level.

We are in the process of working through our annual audit for last year's financial results, 2014/15 season, and I will have more specifics to report next time, however, it is clear that we have a challenge ahead of us to offset the energy costs that continue to rise and have become a significant factor to all curling clubs namely the ever increasing hydro costs. Fortunately Graham and his crew have worked diligently to find ways to reduce the impact by identifying and developing methods that reduce the amount of hydro we use to maintain the ice.

As our new club facility reaches its 10 year anniversary next year, it is only prudent that we "put money aside

for a rainy day", a large part of this process is budgeting \$58,000 annually to build our Capital Replacement Fund. This become more important as our facility ages and will need to invest in repairs & replacement of equipment. This is no easy task however; the finance committee will work toward this goal each and every year to ensure the longevity of our great facility.

- > Mats for the vestibule area that would allow all members and visitors the opportunity to clean their footwear before entering lobby.
- > Please use the boot cleaner, located at the front door, at all times before entering the Foyer
- > Please check your grippers before each game and clean them as necessary.
- > Please dispose of old grippers.
- > Please use the boot cleaners before going onto the ice
- > Please use the sticky mat when going onto the ice and avoid using it when leaving.
- Operations is continuing to work with our Ice Technicians on ways and means to reduce dirt buildup on the ice & provide members and guests with the best ice possible.

Adult Novice Program

Always wanted to try curling, but didn't want to be the only beginner?

RKCC will be providing an 8 week program on Sunday evenings from 7 pm to 9 pm beginning Oct. 4th. These sessions will combine both on & off-ice instruction with actual game play, all in a supportive environment with experienced instructors on each sheet to assist you. The fee of \$150 (free to members), includes a full slider and 2 grippers as well as the use of the club's brooms and stabilizing devices if needed.

This program is based on the Canadian Curling Association's "Getting Started for Adults" program which begins with skill development progressing to game play in the later sessions, where each participant will have the opportunity to play every team position under the tutorship of qualified, experienced instructors.

The aim of this program is to instill a passion for the game and more importantly the confidence to eventually join one of many leagues available to members. For those who wish to join the club, the cost of the Novice Program can be applied towards your RKCC membership.

Should there be sufficient interest, an Adult Novice League will be available to both graduates (for an additional fee) and novice club curlers In January of 2016.
